1. Recognizing Veteran's Day

RESOLUTIONS: (16)

1. Authorizing submission of a petition to the Highlands Council for designation of highlands redevelopment area for Block 8300, Lots 11 & 11.01; Block 8100, Lot 38; and Block 8400, Lot 1

The Township has been approached by a developer and owner of 438-440 Sand Shore Road to secure support for a Highlands Area Redevelopment designation. The properties in question are located within the Highlands Preservation Area and need this designation for site plan approval for two industrial buildings consistent with our Zoning Code. The designation must also include an area that is at least 70 percent existing impervious coverage which is why Johnson dealership and Mt. Olive Parkade shopping center are also included in the plan and have consented to the inclusion. It should be noted that the developer previously had approval for an industrial building, however, encountered complications which prevented the improvements within the allowable time frame.

2. Requesting approval from the Director of the Division of Local Government Services for insertion of a specific item of revenue into the 2022 municipal budget (\$2,863 for the Bulletproof Vest Partnership Grant)

The Director of the Division of Local Government Services needs to approve a special item of revenue into the budget after its adoption. The Township received a Bulletproof Vest Partnership grant in the amount of \$2,863 which needs to be inserted and made available in the budget.

3. Providing for the transfer of 2022 budget appropriations for the current fund and water utility budgets

In accordance with the law, municipalities can only transfer funds during November and December. We have encountered several shortfalls in the following current fund in the amount of \$172,000: Legal, Buildings & Grounds, Fleet, Seniors and Social Security. In addition, the water fund in the amount of \$20,000 needs a transfer to cover the down payment for the PFOA mitigation.

4. Canceling taxes on Block 8600, Lot 23 for disabled veteran declared 100% totally & permanently disabled by the Tax Assessor

The Tax Collector and Tax Assessor recommend canceling taxes for the property owner of Block 8600, Lot 23 for being declared by the VA to be 100% totally and permanently disabled due to a wartime disability. The 2022 taxes will be canceled in the amount of \$3,209.40.

5. Canceling taxes on Block 8800, Lot 36.17 for disabled veteran declared 100% totally & permanently disabled by the Tax Assessor

The Tax Collector and Tax Assessor recommend canceling taxes for the property owner of Block 8800, Lot 36.17 for being declared by the VA to be 100% totally and permanently disabled due to a wartime disability. The 2022 taxes will be canceled in the amount of \$3,578.11.

6. Authorizing the use of North Jersey Wastewater Cooperative Pricing System (NJWCPS) for 2022 (Pumping Services, Inc.)

In accordance with the local public contracts law, the Township desires to purchase various pumps and motor repairs off the NJWCPS contract from Pumping Services, Inc.

7. Authorizing the use of Somerset County Cooperative Pricing System Contract for 2022 (GTBM)

In accordance with the local public contracts law, the Township desires to purchase traffic control signs and equipment off of the Somerset County Co-op from GTBM.

8. Approving a "non-fair and open" vendor service contract to Motion Kia for a 36-month lease of three vehicles, pursuant to the Pay-to-Play Law *Revised - added lessor and VIN numbers

The vendor service contract with Kia needs to be revised to include additional language related to the finance company and VIN numbers. No other changes will be made to the contract.

9. Authorizing the award of a contract for RFP #01-2022 Architectural Design Services for the Expansion of the Senior Center (The Musial Group) *Revised - Increasing contract amount

The initial contract to The Musial Group for architectural services for the new Senior Center project needs to be increased by \$86,598 from \$118,735 to \$205,333. The increase is due to the scope of work changing from a one-story building to a building with a basement which requires more engineering.

10. Authorizing the award of a contract for RFP #01-2022 Architectural Design Services for 5 Pondview Lane (The Musial Group)

The Musial Group submitted a proposal for architectural services for the Pondview property and a contract will be awarded in the amount of \$58,450. I anticipate this contact amount being increased in the future as we uncover potential difficiencies in the structure.

11. Authorizing the award of a contract to Nicoletti Snow Removal, LLC for Bid #05-2022 Snowplowing Services

The Township advertised for bids in accordance with the local public contracts for Snowplowing Services to assist the Department of Public Works with snow removal in certain developments, specifically Old Budd Lake Area/Outlook Park and Morris Chase/Morris Hunt. One (1) bid was received from Nicoletti Snow Removal, LLC. The total contract amount will be for \$80,000 over the next two years. Outsourcing this service in certain developments reduces overtime and allows our staff to focus on the primary roads.

12. Authorizing the award of a professional services agreement for Township Auditor to Gary Higgins of PKF O'Connor Davies, LLP *Revised - Increasing contract amount

The professional service agreement to PKF O'Connor Davies, LLP needs to be increased by \$10,400 needed to fulfill the remainder of the contract period, bringing the total contract to \$110,400.

13. Authorizing the award of contract extension (year 1) to Ciocca Ford Lincoln of Flemington for Bid #18-2020 Re-Bid Auto Parts for Fleet Vehicles (December 19, 2022 - December 18, 2023)

The Township has a contract with Ciocca Ford Lincoln of Flemington for auto parts which is expiring on December 18, 2022. The contract allows for a one-year extension under the same terms and conditions. The one-year contract extension is for \$65,000 and will expire on December 18, 2023.

14. Authorizing the award of a professional service agreement for Labor Attorney to Cleary, Giacobee, Alfieri, Jacobs *Revised - Increasing contract amount

The professional service agreement to our Labor Attorney needs to be increased by \$50,000 to fulfill the remainder of the contract period, bringing the total contract to \$130,000.

15. Authorizing the township to abate a nuisance property located at Block 4100, Lot 74 (Chamberlain Lane)

The property owner has failed to maintain the exterior of their property creating a nuisance and violation of the code. Violations notices have been sent with no response from the owner. A lien will be placed on the home in order to abate the nuisance.

16. Authorizing the institution of an in-rem tax foreclosure

The Tax Collector recommends instituting an in-rem tax foreclosure proceeding against the attached properties to be in the best interest of the municipality and will result in revenue to the Township by either redemption of the subject property or by foreclosure and resale by the Township.

The Rachel Manor Estates development is near completion and under the terms of the Developers Agreement, various ROW, road dedications and easements need to authorized and accepted. The Township engineer and attorney have reviewed and recommend approval.

Ord.#28-2022

An Ordinance of the Township of Mount Olive, County of Morris, State of New Jersey, Amending the Township Code to Establish Chapter 130, "Business Insurance Registration," as Required by State Law.

This ordinance will replace the recently approved Business Insurance Registration ordinance which is required by State Law and removes the enforcement penalty.

Ord.#29-2022

An Ordinance of the Township of Mount Olive, County of Morris, State of New Jersey, Amending the Township Code to Establish Chapter 262, "Nepotism, Policy Against," to Codify the Township's Existing Nepotism Policy.

As recommended by the State which was discovered during the Best Practices Inventory, it is recommended that our Nepotism Policy be codified in an ordinace.

ORDINANCE FOR SECOND READING: (2)

Ord.#25-2022

Bond Ordinance Providing For PFOA Remediation for the Pinecrest Water System in and by the Township of Mount Olive, in the County of Morris, New Jersey, Appropriating \$400,000 Therefor and Authorizing the Issuance of \$380,000 Bonds or Notes of the Township to Finance Part of the Cost Thereof.

The Township needs to mitigate PFOA's in the Pinecrest water system. The preliminary budget estimates for construction costs (equipment, building modifications and installation) will be approximately \$425,000 in addition to another \$235,000 in permitting and engineering costs for a total of \$660,000. Approximately \$300,000 has already been re-allocated from previous capital budgets to fund these improvements and an additional \$400,000 needs to be approratied for the expedited remediation.
