1. Recognizing Vincent DeCarlo and Anthony Vasquez for their heroic efforts on July 12, 2023 during a car crash on Route 46

RESOLUTIONS: (15)

- 1. Accepting the 2022 Fire and Rescue Audits State statute requires fire departments to provide to the Governing Body, on an annual basis, an account of the use of all the funds the Township appropriates to the volunteer departments. Financial Statements have been provided, will be kept on file in the Finance Office and can be accepted.
- 2. Authorizing a Chapter 159 Budget Amendment in the 2023 Budget for the LEAP Shared Service Czar Program for \$342,465

The Township received grant funding in the amount of \$342,465 to purchase a new garbage truck and trash cans to service the Netcong Sanitation contract. The Director of the Division of Local Government Services needs to approve the insertion of the grant into our budget.

3. Requesting approval from the Director of the Division of Local Government Services for insertion of a specific item of revenue into the 2023 Municipal Budget (\$307,327 for Enhancing Local Public Health FY24)

The Township received grant funding in the amount of \$307,327 for the Enhancing Local Public Health program. The Director of the Division of Local Government Services needs to approve the insertion of the grant into our budget.

4. Notice of intent to award a contract under a National Cooperative Purchasing Agreement for the purchase of a camera trailer off the Sourcewell Co-op (Aries Industries)

As per the local public contracts law, the Township is permitted to join national cooperative purchasing agreements. The Township is a member of the Sourcewell Coop and has a need for a camera trailer. Aries Industries was awarded the contract through the co-op and has submitted a quote for a Badger Tractor system in the amount of \$13,623. A Notice of Intent to Award will be advertised in accordance with the law giving local vendors an opportunity to challenge the contract.

5. Authorizing purchases off New Jersey State Contracts pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-12 for calendar year 2023 (Witmer Public Safety Group) The Township has a need to purchase firefighter protective clothing and equipment off the New Jersey State Contract through Witmer Public Safety Group.

6. Authorizing the award of a contract for the purchase of equipment and spare parts off the North Jersey Wastewater Cooperative Pricing System (Pumping Services, Inc.)

The Township has a need to purchase equipment and spare parts for pump station #5 from the North Jersey Wastewater Cooperative Pricing System. Pumping Services, Inc. has submitted a proposal in the amount of \$23,629.35.

7. Authorizing the purchase of a water valve exerciser off the Buyboard National Purchasing Cooperative (EH Wachs)

The Township previously advertised a Notice of Intent of Award to purchase a water valve exerciser through the BuyBoard National Purchasing Cooperative from EH Wachs in the amount of \$109,527.72. There were no alternative approaches and/or rejections made by any New Jersey vendor and it is recommended to move forward with the purchase.

8. Authorizing the use of Morris County Cooperative Pricing Council Contract for 2023 (Tilcon New York)

The Township has a need to purchase goods from the Morris County Cooperative Pricing Council from Tilcon for Road Resurfacing.

9. Authorizing the award of a non-fair and open professional services agreement for Pyrotechnic Services to International Fireworks MFG. Co. REVISED - Increasing contract amount and reallocating funds

The contract for pyrotechnic services to International Fireworks needs to be increased by \$1,300 to fulfill the remainder of the contract. Increase is due to the canceled fireworks during the carnival due to the rain.

10. Approving a non-fair and open vendor service contract pursuant to New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law (General Alarm dba General Security) REVISED -Increasing contract amount

The contract for security equipment and hardware maintenance with General Security needs to be increased to \$27,595.18 for additional cameras.

- 11. Authorizing the use of Open Space Funds for the installation of an aeration fountain in Turkey Brook Retention Pond (Aquatics Analysts, Inc.) The Township has a need to install and remove the aeration fountain in the Turkey Brook Retention pond which is used to manage aquatic weed and algae growth. Aquatic Analysts, Inc. has submitted a proposal not to exceed \$720. Open space funds will be used for this purpose.
- 12. Authorizing the use of Open Space funds for management of Pondview Drive Pond aquatic weed and algae growth (Aquatics Analysts, Inc.) Revised - Increase in treatment cost

The cost for the aquatic plant/algae control for the Pondview Drive Pond has increased by \$30.00 and is now \$595.00 per treatment. The maximum value of this contract will remain at \$3,000. This is to be paid using Open Space funds and needs a resolution for approval.

13. Authorizing the award of a non-fair and open professional services agreement for Pyrotechnic Services to International Fireworks MFG Co. Revised - Increasing contract amount and re-allocating funds

The Township's agreement with International Fireworks needs to be increased an additional \$2,580 to cover unforeseen expenses. The maximum dollar value of this agreement is now \$23,080.

14. Authorizing the Township to abate a nuisance property located at Block 6100, Lot 7 (19 Deerfield Place)

The owners of 19 Deerfield Place have failed to maintain the exterior of their property, creating a nuisance. A notice of violation and order of abatement was issued and rectified. The Township needs to abate the nuisance and a lien will be assessed against the property.

15. Authorizing the Township to abate a nuisance property located at Block 4701, Lot 9.02 (217 Flanders Netcong Road)

The owners of 217 Flanders Netcong Road have failed to maintain the exterior of their property, creating a nuisance. A notice of violation and order of abatement was issued and rectified. The Township needs to abate the nuisance and a lien will be assessed against the property.

ORDINANCE FOR FIRST READING: (2)

Ord.#21-2023 An Ordinance of the Township of Mount Olive, County of Morris, State of New Jersey, Amending Chapter 343, Stormwater Management, of the Township Code to Establish NJDEP-Mandated Regulations for Privately Owned Salt Storage.

As part of the new stormwater permit requirement, the NJDEP is requiring municipalities to adopt certain ordinances to further protect the stormwater system. One such ordinance is to regulate privately owned salt storage sheds. The purpose of the ordinance to is prevent stored salt and other solid de-icing materials from being exposed to stormwater. We are not aware of any privately owned storage. Ord.#22-2023 An Ordinance Amending Ordinance #31-2022 of the Township of Mount Olive Entitled Salaries of Certain Exempt and Non-Union Personnel. To establish the salary range for Fire Watcher set per ordinance.
