- 1. A resolution to terminate all participation under the SHBP and SEHBP (including prescription drug plan and/or dental plan coverage)**

The Township has conducted an extensive analysis of the health insurance and prescription drug plans offered to current and retired employees and has determined that it is in the best interest of the Township to terminate its participation in the State Health Benefits Program and move toward a more cost-effective and stable Health Insurance Fund through the North Jersey Municipal Employee Benefits Fund. The NJMEBF has proposed to mirror/duplicate the current plans in place and provide the same level of benefits that are currently in place. All limits such as medical copays, coinsurance amounts, deductibles and/or day/dollar limits will remain the same. The savings in premium cost is estimated to be over \$700,000.

- 2. Authorizing the Township to join the North Jersey Municipal Employee Fund**

The Township has conducted an extensive analysis of the health insurance and prescription drug plans offered to current and retired employees and has determined that it is in the best interest of the Township to terminate its participation in the State

Health Benefits Program and move toward a more cost-effective and stable Health Insurance Fund through the North Jersey Municipal Employee Benefits Fund. The NJMEBF has proposed to mirror/duplicate the current plans in place and provide the same level of benefits that are currently in place. All limits such as medical copays, coinsurance amounts, deductibles and/or day/dollar limits will remain the same. The savings in premium cost is estimated to be over \$700,000.

3. Authorizing the award of a professional service agreement without competitive bidding to John E. Keefe, Jr. Esq. to provide special legal counsel services to the Township of Mount Olive

As a result of the stringent government regulations regarding PFAS in drinking water, a third-party class action, multi-state litigation has been instituted to hold parties responsible for the contamination. The Township desires to participate in such litigation and needs to retain special legal counsel to protect the interests of the Township. John E. Keefe, Jr. Esq. of Wilenz, Goldman & Spitzer, PA has been involved in the litigation from the beginning, was interviewed by staff professionals and has provided a proposal to conduct work for the Township. There is no out-of-pocket expense to the Township. Only if there is monetary recovery will the firm be paid a contingent fee between 25% - 33-1/3% in the event of a settlement.

4. Requesting approval from the Director of the Division of Local Government Services for insertion of a specific item of revenue into the 2023 Municipal Budget (\$5,000 donation - Walmart - Police Supplies)

Walmart has donated \$5,000 to the Police Department for police supplies. In accordance with the law, the Director of the Division of Local Government Services needs to approve the insertion into the budget as revenue to be utilized in 2023.

5. Requesting approval from the Director of the Division of Local Government Services for insertion of a specific item of revenue into the 2023 Municipal Budget (\$2,140 - Spotted Lantern Fly Prevention)

A grant was received in the amount of \$2,140 which will be used to reimburse the Township for expenses related to treating the Spotted Lantern Fly. In accordance with the law, the Director of the Division of Local Government Services needs to approve the insertion into the budget as revenue to be utilized in 2023.

6. Requesting approval from the Director of the Division of Local Government Services for insertion of a specific item of revenue into the 2023 Municipal Budget (\$2,650.24 for National Opioid Settlement Grant)

A settlement fund was received in the amount of \$2,650.24 related to the National Opioid Settlement Grant. In accordance with the law, the Director of the Division of Local Government Services needs to approve the insertion into the budget as revenue to be utilized in 2023.

7. Authorizing the award of a professional services agreement for engineering and construction administration services - Pinecrest Water System (Van Cleef Engineering Associates)

The Township has a need to acquire professional services for engineering and construction administration services for the Pinecrest Water System as a "non-fair and open" contract pursuant to the States Pay-to-Play laws. Van Cleef Engineering has submitted a proposal not to exceed \$67,500.

8. Authorizing the award of a contract for RFP #03-2023 Preventative Maintenance and Support of Radio Networks (Spectrum Communications)

The Township authorized the use of a competitive contract process in lieu of public bidding in accordance with the law for preventative maintenance and support services of the police department's public safety simulcast radio infrastructure. Proposals were solicited and one was received from Major Automotive Installations, Inc. (dba Spectrum Communications). The Evaluation Committee recommends a contract be awarded for a two-year period not to exceed \$200,860, in addition to an hours labor rate of \$165 for non-contract repairs and a 20% discount on parts.

9. Authorizing the use of Open Space funds for the management of Turkey Brook retention pond aquatic weed and algae growth (Aquatic Analysts, Inc.)

A previously awarded contract to Aquatic Analysts, Inc. for the management of Turkey Brook Park retention pond for aquatic weed and algae growth needs to be revised to increase the contract amount by \$65 to fulfill the remainder of the contract period bringing the total contract amount to \$3,065.

10. Authorizing participation in the American Rescue Plan Firefighter grant
